ENGLISH 1 (2nd Year)

Description

The E1 lettorato provides valuable support for the Lingua Inglese 1 course and preparation for the exam. It aims to help students develop both language and soft skills at B2+ level. Specifically, it focuses on academic writing, professional email English and speaking skills, particularly for presenting in English.

Participating in the lettorato is essential to exam preparation. You will be assessed on both email English and presentations as parts of your final evaluation. The lettorato offers the opportunity to prepare for the presentation exam – which counts towards 20% of the final mark - in smaller groups and even individually by appointment, when possible. **A rehearsal presentation in the context of the lettorato is compulsory before sitting the oral presentation exam.** The rehearsal as a rule take place while classes are being taught, not during the exam sessions. Please ensure that you book your presentation rehearsal in good time ahead of the date when you propose to take the exam.

The E1 lettorato currently has 3 slots of weekly lessons. You will be required to attend at least 1. This will be clarified and organized during the first lesson on 23 September.

ENGLISH 2 (3rd Year)

Description

The E2 lettorato is a key component of the E2 course. It offers further practice in all four language skills at B2+/C1 level with a special focus on academic vocabulary.

The E2 lettorato lessons are addressed to both the whole class and small groups. This will be clarified and organized at the beginning of the academic year.

ENGLISH STUDIES ADVANCED (MA) Students

Description

The ESA lettorato forms an integral part of the ESA course. It aims to assist students in developing academic language skills at B2+/C1, especially writing. This is essential to exam preparation. During the lettorato, students have the opportunity to discuss their writing and receive feedback, which is paramount to improvement.
